(b) All of the shore lands of the second class containing 5.106 acres lying in front of said B.B. Bishop Donation Land Claim as conveyed by the State of Washington to Oregon Railway & Navigation Company by a certain deed of indenture dated July 14, 1896 as recorded on pages 60 and 61,319 and 320 of Book "E" of therecords of deeds af said county deed is hereby made for a more specific description of Skamania, reference to which said shore lands.
