NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) to h im in hand paid by the said parties of the second part, the said party of the first mart has and by these presents does hereby transfer and assign, received release and forever quitclaim unto each of the parties of the second part an undivided one-fourth interest in and to all of the property of the estate of I.O. Wing, deceased, both real and personal and wheresoever situate, except such as has heretofore been conveyed to Margaret Wing, the surviving widow of J.O. Wing, deceased; and empecially does said party of the first part remise, release and forever quitclaim unto each of said parties of the second part and undivided one-fourth interest in and to the following described tracts of real estate situated in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, to-wit:

The North half $(N\frac{1}{2})$ of the southeast quarter $(SE\frac{1}{4})$ and the mouthwest quarter $(SW\frac{1}{4})$ of the southeast quarter $(SE\frac{1}{4})$ of Section Seventeen (17) in Tourship one North (T 1 N) Range five East (R 5 E) of the Williamette Meridian containing 120 acres.

Lot one (1) and the northwest quarter (NW+) of Section sixteen (Sec. 16) Township one North (T 1 N) Range Five East (R 5 E), Williamette Megidian, containing 188.50 acres, mote or less, according to the Government survey thereof.

This conveyance, assignment and transfer being subject, however, to the debts and expenses of administration of the said estate of J.O. Wing, deceased.

It being the intent and purpose of this instrument to carry out and perform the provisions of that certain contract made and entered into between the party of the first part and the parties of the second part on the 28th day of November, 1916; and it being the intent and purpose of this conveyance to effect a distribution of the estate of said J.O. Wing, deceased, so that the party of the first part, and the parties of the second part shall each own an undivided one-fourth interest in and to the said estate and every part and parcel of the property belonging thereto, subject pmly to the costs of administration and the debts of said estate.
