(SHERIFF) KNOX to GRAVES.

THIS INDENTURE, Made this 17'th day of May 1918, between S.L. Knox Sheriff of the County of Skamania State of Washington, party of the first part, and Adolphus Graves and Alice M. Graves, husband and wife, of the County of Skamania State of Washington, parties of the second part, witnesseth; THAT WHEREAS, By virtue of a special execution issued out of and under the seal of the Superior Court of the State of Washington, in and for Skamania County on the 22'nd day of November 1916, in favor of Adolphus Graves and Alice M. Graves, Husband and wife, and against R.B. Young and Bertha A. Young husband and wife, and to the Sheriff of said County duly directed and delivered, commanding him to sell the property hereinafter described, at public auction, according to law, as by the said special execution, reference being thereunto had, more fully appears; AND WHEREAS, Pursuant to said special execution the said Sheriff on the 23'rd day of December 1916, did duly sell the premises hereinafter described, at public auction, according to law, to Adolphus Graves and Alice M. Graves, husband and wife, who was the highest ~~and~~ bidder therefor, for the sum of \$967.35 Nine Hundred sixty seven and  $\frac{35}{100}$  Dollars, lawful money of the United States of America, which was the highest and best sum ~~bidden~~ and the whole price paid therefor; the said Sheriff first given due and legal notice of the time and place of said sale, according to law; AND WHEREAS, ~~XXXXXX~~ The Sheriff, after receiving from said purchaser the sum of money so bidden as aforesaid, gave to them such certificate as is by law required to be given. AND WHEREAS, On the 15'th day of February, 1917, the said Superior Court, by an order duly made and entered, confirmed said sale;
