Cronan, the part of the second part, WITNESSETH, That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar and other valuable consideration DOLLARS, lawful money of the United States of America, to me in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents remise, release, convey and forever quit claim unto the said part... of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns, all that certain real property situate and being in the County of Skamania State of Washington, described as follows, to wit:

The southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Twenty-six (26), Township Two (2), North Range Five (5) NWM., containing 160 acres more or less.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said premises, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in anywise appertaining, and thereversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof, unto said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever.
