It is further Considered, Ordered, Adjudged and Decreed, that the said appraisement of said estate be and the same hereby is approved by this Court; that no part or portion of said estate is subject to or liable for any inheritance tax, and that the said estate, and each and every part thereof be and the same hereby is released and discharged from any and all liens and claims of the State of Washington for such inheritance tax; that the said estate is fully solvent, and the said George E.
