I John Baughman, being first duly sworn on oath say: That I am a citizen of the United States and a resident of Stevenson, Skamania County, Washington; That I have been a resident of Skamania County, Washington for more than fifty years. That I was well acquainted with Mary Wil-wy-i-tit, a Cascade Indian, Patentee of the Southeast quarter of Section 33 Township Two North of Range Six East of the Willamette Meridian, Washington, containing One Hundred sixty acres; Patent No. 625771, Patent dated April 17, 1918, "766369, 1542-18 I.O., Vancouver, 11 Appl," during her lifetime, That the said Mary Wil-wy-i-tit was the wife of one Henry Wil-wy-i-tit, That I was present at their marriage ceremony. That the said Henry Wil-wy-i-tit died about the year 1872, and thereafter the said Mary Wil-wy-i-tit married one John Stooquin. That thereafter she died on or about the 21st day of December, 1906, and her estate was duly probated in the Superior Court of the State of Washington for the County of Skamania, under the name of Mary Stooquin; deceased.
