(c) Franchises granted February 18, 1929, by the Board of County Commissioners of Mason County to the Company's predecessor, Peoples West Coast Hydro-Electric Corporation.

(d) Franchise granted July 3, 1929, by the Board of County Commissioners of Mason County to the Company's predecessor, Peoples West Coast Hydro-Electric Corporation.

(e) Franchise granted July 7, 1930, by the Board of County Commissioners of Mason County to the Company's predecessor, Peoples West Coast Hydro-Electric Corporation.

(f) Franchise granted September 3, 1930, by the Board of County Commissioners of Mason County to the Company's predecessor, Peoples West Coast Hydro-Electric Corporation.

(g) Franchise No. 382 granted July 31, 1928 by State Highway Committee of the State of Washington, to the Company's predecessor, Peoples West Coast Hydro-Electric Corporation.

(h) Franchise No. 532 granted October 21, 1930 by the Director of Highways of the State of Washington to the Company's predecessor, Peoples West Coast Hydro-Electric Corporation.

(b) That portion of the southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the northwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of said Section six (6) described as follows, to-wit:
