NORTHWEST QUARTER OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER (NW of SE 1), --

RESERVING AND ACCEPTING THEREFROM ALL OIL AND MINERAL RIGHTS, TOGETHER WITH THE RIGHT TO ENTER INTO AND UPON SAID DESCRIBED PROPERTY, OR ANY PART THEREOF, FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXPLORING FOR, PROSPECTING, DEVELOPING, CONSTRUCTING AND OPERATING OIL WELLS, REFINERIES, PIPE LINES, MINES AND TUNNELS, WITH THE RIGHT TO CROSS WITH SAID CONSTRUCTION, OR ANY PART THEREOF, ANY OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED LAND, WITH ALL NECESSARY AND CONVENIENT FACILITIES, EITHER ABOVE OR BELOW THE SURFACE OF THE GROUND, INCLUDING THE RIGHT TO CONSTRUCT ALL BUILDINGS, AND MAKE ALL EXCAVATIONS, OPENINGS, DITCHES, DRAINS, RAILROADS, WAGON ROADS AND OTHER IMPROVEMENTS UPON SAID PREMISES, WHICH ARE, OR MAY BECOME, NECESSARY OR SUITABLE FOR THE OPENING AND OPERATING OF OIL WELLS, AND MINES, AND THE REMOVAL OF THE PRODUCTS THEREOF FROM SAID PREMISES.

A LOGGING RAILROAD, TOGETHER WITH TIES, RAILS, SWITCHES, FROGS AND OTHER PARAPHER-NALIA IN PLACE, BEGINNING AT A POINT IN THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION THIRTY SIX (36), TOWNSHIP THREE (3) NORTH, RANGE SIX (6) EAST OF THE WILLAMETTE MERIDIAN, IN SKAMANIA COUNTY, WASHINGTON, (BELONGING TO THE STATE OF WASHINGTON), AND RUNNING THENCE ACROSS THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF THE NORTHEAST QUARTER (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ OF NE $\frac{1}{4}$) OF SECTION ONE (1), TOWNSHIP TWO (2) NORTH, RANGE SIX (6) EAST OF THE WILLAMETTE MERIDIAN, AND THE WEST HALF (W $\frac{1}{2}$) OF SECTION SIX (6), TOWNSHIP TWO (2) NORTH, RANGE SEVEN (7) EAST OF THE WILLAMETTE MERIDIAN, IN A GENERAL SOUTHEASTERLY DIRECTION,—

Thence a right-of-way sixty (60) feet in width, being thirty (30) feet on either side of the center line of the railroad as located and laid out over and across the northwest quarter (NW_4^1) and the east half of the southwest quarter (E_2^1 of SW_4^1) of section seven (7), township two (2) north, range seven (7) east of the Willamette Meridian, the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter (NE_4^1 of NW_4^1), the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter (SW_4^1 of NE_4^1) and the west half of the southeast quarter (W_2^1 of SE_4^1) of section eighteen (18), township two (2) north, range seven (7) east of the Willamette Meridian;

Thence a right-of-way fifty (50) feet in width, being twenty five (25) feet on either side of the center line of the said railroad, as located and laid out over and across the east half (E_2^1) and the south half of the southwest quarter (S_2^1 of SW_4^1) of section nineteen (19) township two (2) north, range seven (7) east of the Willamette Meridian, and the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter (NW_4^1 of NW_4^1) of section thirty (30), township two (2) north, range seven (7) east of the Willamette Meridian, and that portion of section twenty five (25), township two (2) north, range six (6) east of the Willamette Meridian, not included in the Snooks Donation Land Claim;

Together with a leasehold right acquired under and by virtue of that certain lease of December II, 1917, from J. F. Ridenour and Ada S. Ridenour, Husband and Wife, to William H. Putnam, Receiver for the J. K. Lumber Company, expiring April I, 1941, in and to the following:--located in the Snooks Donation Land Claim, in section twenty five (25), town-ship two (2) north, range six (6) east of the Willamette Meridian, to wit:--

FIRST:- LOGGING RAILROAD (SAID LOGGING RAILROAD HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO BEING A CONTINUATION OF THAT HEREINABOVE DESCRIBED) (CONSISTING OF TWO HUNDRED FORTY EIGHT (248) FIFTY SIX POUND, STANDARD STEEL RAILS, EACH APPROXIMATELY THIRTY FEET IN LENGTH, TOGETHER WITH TIES FOR SAME; ONE SIDING ADJACENT TO SAID MAIN LINE LOGGING RAILROAD, CONSISTING OF THIRTY FOUR (34) FIFTY SIX POUND, STANDARD STEEL RAILS, EACH APPROXIMATELY THIRTY FEET IN LENGTH, WITH TIES THEREFOR, AND ONE FROG SITUATED AT THE JUNCTION OF SAID SIDING WITH SAID MAIN LINE RAILROAD, ALL AS CONSTRUCTED, PLACED AND BUILT ON SAID DONATION LAND CLAIM ON
