THIS INDENTURE, Made this 17th day of November, 1930 between A.P.Gordon, Sheriff of County of Skamania, State of Washington, party of the first part, and William T.Lynch, of the County of Clark State of Washington party of the second part, witnesseth

THAT WHEREAS, BY VIRTUE OF A SPECIAL execution and order of sale issued out of and under the seal of the Superior Court of the State of Washington, in and for Skamania County on the 27th day of August 1929, in favor of William T. Lynch and aganst Hansen Contracting Company, a corporation, Edward A. Cross . C. H. Cross, the unknown heirs of Edward A. Cross, deceased, and all other parties claiming any right to property hereinafter described and to the Sheriff of said county duly directed and delivered, commanding him to sell the property hereinafter described at public auction, according to law, as by the said special execution, reference being thereunto had, more fully appears:
