RIGHT-OF-WAY DEED

(road or trail)

THIS INDENTURE, made the 13th day of May in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, between Manhattan Company of the County of Multnomah, State of Oregon, granter, party of the first part, and the Secretary of Agriculture of the United States Department of Agriculture for and in behalf of the United States of America, grantee, party of the second part,

WITNESSSETH:

That for and in consideration of one dollar (\$1) in hand paid, receipt whereof is hereby duly acknowledged, the party of the first part does hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey, and confirm unto the United States of America, an easement and right of way in gross over the following tract, lot, piece, ormparcel, of land, situate, lying and being in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, and bounded and particularly described as follows: S1 of Sec. 21 T 4 N, R 7 E, W.M.

The said right of way hereby granted is for the maintenance, and full, free, and quiet use and enjoyment by the United States of America for any and all purposes by them desired or deemed necessary or beneficial for or in connection with the control, administration, or use of the National Forests or the resources thereof, and, so far as may be with that enjoyment compatible, by the general public as a public highway being forty feet in width, and traversing the above-described premises according to the following general courses and direction, to wit: A right of way 40 feet wide from the South boundary of Sec. 21, T 4 N, R 7 E, beginning at a point near the quarter corner and extending in a northwesterly direction along the east bank of Trout Creek to the west boundary of section 21.

This grant shall be effective only so long as said easement shall be actually used
