Sam Samson, being first duly sworn says: I am a citizen of the United States, over the age of Twenty-one years, residing at Stevenson in Skamania County Washington; that from the time of the incorporation of the Skamania Light & Power Company until subsequent to the year 1921 I was President of said corporation and familiar with all of its affairs. That about the year 1915 the said corporation sold and conveyed to Skamania County for the use of the Game Commission of said County a certain parcel of land in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 36, township 3 North of Range 7 East of Willamette Meridian and the deed therefore was recorded at page 203, book P of Deeds, records of Skamania County. Subsequently the Game Commission of Skamania County purchased additional land surrounding the original property consisting of all the property belonging to the company in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 36 South of the North boundary of the Town of Stevenson. The said property together with the original description being the same land described in deed from Skamania County Game Commission to Leon P. Montchalin, recorded at Page 250 Book "X" of Deeds. The deed to the property was duly executed by myself as President and attested by A. L. Orsen its secretary, and was delivered to W. G. Hufford, chairman of the Game Commission for Skamania County. In consideration therefore the Company received a County Game fund warrant in the sum of \$400.00. This property was never thereafter claimed by the Skamania Light & Power Company.
