All the rest and residue of my property of every kind and nature whether the same be personal property, real estate, money or notes and mortgages, or mixed property, in truth and in fact every kind of property of whatever kind or nature, I, give and bequeath unto my beloved husband, to have and to hold forever, my husbands name being Burdett D. Brumagin.

It is my will and desire that my said husband Burdett D. Brumagin, shall serve as executor of this my last will and testament, and he shall serve without bonds.

It is my will and desire, that after this my last will is filed and proven as the laws of the state of Washington direct that my estate be settled up without any further intervention of the probate court or any other court Whatever.
