Hamilton, and I granted to the United States of America a perpetual flowage easement over a portion of land situate in Section 36, Township 3 North, Range 71 East of the Willamette Meridian, Skemenia County, Washington; that there are no vested or accrued water rights or vested rights to ditches or reservoirs used in connection therewith that exist by reason of local customs, laws or decisions, nor are there any parties in possession not shown of record. I also say that there are no mechanics' lien claims affecting said property, not shown of record. I further say that the Columbia Valley Railroad Company has at no time constructed or maintained a line of railroad through or near the land over which I granted a flowage easement to the United States of America. I also say that the exception referred to in that certain deed dated March 19, 1906, recorded March 27, 1906 in Book "I" of Deeds, page 526, Records of Skamania County, Washington, wherein William T. Shepard was grantor and Richard N. Shepard and James Shepard were grantees, said exception being a 29-acrestract conveyed by William T.
