

United States to John W. Stevenson.

To all whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Certificate } Whereas, John W. Stevenson, of Skamania County, Washington
 No 756 } Territory has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States
 a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, whereby it appears
 that full payment has been made by said John W. Stevenson, according
 to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled
 "An act making further provisions for the sale of public lands," for the
 Lots numbered one, two and three of Section ten, in Township one
 North of Range five east, in the District of Lands subject to sale
 at Vancouver, Washington, Territory, containing one hundred
 and fourteen acres, and twenty-five hundredths of an acre,
 according to the official plat of the survey of said lands, returned
 to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said
 tract has been purchased by the said John W. Stevenson.

Now know ye, that the United States of America, in
 consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several
 acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and
 granted, and by these presents do give, and grant, unto the said
 John W. Stevenson and to his heirs, the said tract above described
 to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges,
 immunitiess, and appurtenances, of whatever nature, there-
 unto belonging unto the said John W. Stevenson and to his heirs
 and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof I, Andrew Johnson, President of
 the United States of America have caused these letters to be
 made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be
 hereunto affixed.
