Notice is hereby given that the undersigned citizens of the United States claim fifteen hundred feet linear measure on this lode or vein of gold or silver bearing quartz.

Commencing at this notice and monument and running Easterly therefrom along the line of the lode 1500 feet to a stake marked East end center stake and West along the line of said lode a distance of 1500 feet to a stake West and center stake, with the dips, spurs and angles of the said lode together with the surface ground on each side of said lode bounded and described as following to wit: Commencing
