

NOTICE OF LOCATION.

Notice is hereby given that I the undersigned citizen of the United States claim fifteen hundred feet linear measure on this lode or vein of gold or silver bearing quartz.

Commencing at this notice and monument and running Westerly therefrom along the line of the lode 1500 feet to a stake marked west end center stake and East along the line of said lode a distance of 1500 feet to a stake marked East end center stake, with the dips, spurs and angles of said lode together with the surface ground on each side of said lode, bounded and described as follows to wit:
