

Harry C. Bugick & Edward N. Hamilton del.

This memorandum of agreement made and entered into the 20th day of May 1896, by and between Edward N. Hamilton, Richard Kelsey, and William Braden, of the first part, and Harry C. Bugick of the second part - Witnesseth:-

That in consideration of the sum of Twenty-four dollars to him in hand paid by the first parties, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Harry C. Bugick, hereby agrees without further expense to the parties of the first part to prospect for Gold and Silver and any and all precious minerals in such places as shall be deemed proper, and if he shall discover precious metals in sufficient quantities, said party of the second part shall locate mining claims upon the same in accordance with the laws of the United States: all discoveries made by said party of the second part shall be the joint ownership of the said parties, said Harry C. Bugick to have an undivided half interest in such discoveries and locations and the parties of the first part to have an undivided half interest therein. The expenses of perfecting title to such claims to be divided equally between the parties of the first part and the party of the second part but the party of the second part is to pay all his expenses in prospecting for and discovering such minerals.

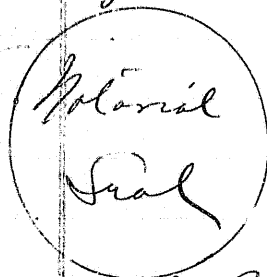
