

M. W. O'Connor to K. Lindloff

Agreement made this day between M. W. O'Connor of Toledo, Wash party of the first part and K. Lindloff of Toledo, Wash party of the second part

Whereas the party of the second part in behalf of himself his wife and his friends wishes to have explored a certain part of the Cascade Mountains east from here in order to make discoveries of valuable minerals and at the same time to locate and stake out lode claims and placer claims on the discoveries thus to be made, the party of the first part agrees hereby to accomplish this work faithfully and in the exclusive interest of the party of the second part under the following conditions to wit:

The party of the second part furnishes to the party of the first part the camp outfit and provisions necessary to do this work during the term of this agreement. The said provisions to be brought at the expense of the party of the second part either to a certain locality known as the Mining Creek Forks, Queen City or Flat Northern Camp or to Camp Denster as the case may be. From there the party of the first part agrees to bring the same to the place of his work himself.

The party of the second part agrees to pay the party of the first part thirty five (\$35) dollars wages per month for the term of this agreement and further agrees to furnish him a reliable good man to help him along in his work. This man to be paid by the party of the second

part. The party of the second part reserves for himself the exclusive right

1. To decide about the duration of this agreement which shall not be shorter in any case but six weeks from the day of the start into the mountains

2. To decide about the localities which shall be prospected and the number of claims to be located

3 To furnish the names of the claimants and the names under which the different discoveries shall be registered and

4. To decide without contradiction if he will accept the different discoveries as mineral claims or not.

The party of the second part authorizes the party of the first part to locate claims in his his wife's and his friends names by furnishing him a Power of Attorney for locating mining claims and places granted to hold good for the duration of this agreement.

The party of the first part hereby agrees to keep strictly secret to words outwardly everything pertaining to this enterprise, but to furnish to the party of the second part every information without any exception which he attains by prospecting the region to be explored and further agrees hereby not to locate any claim for himself or other parties in this region during the present year provided however that he will obtain the permit in every single case to do so from the party of the second part before doing so The party of the first part promises to report regularly at

least once a month about his observations and discoveries to the party of the second part.

The party of the second part having at hand certain parties taking a lively interest in this mining region and having promised him a certain interest in the discoveries to be made agree hereby to let have the party of the first part a five (5) per cent non-assessable interest in all the discoveries they expect to make during the term of this agreement.

Both parties agree hereby to have this agreement registered in the Mining Registers of the St. Lewis Mining District but not before they will have succeeded to take hold of the treasures to be discovered.

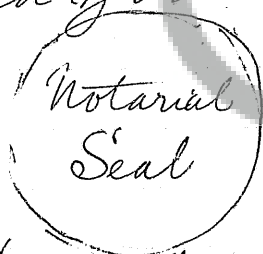
