ARTICLES OF CORPORATION OF THE WIND RIVER MILL AND
MERCANTILE COMPANY.

Know all men by these presents that Biva Wittie, a citizen of the United States and resident of Bridal Veil Mulnomah County State of Oregon: John Backus a citizen of the United States and resident of Portland, Mulnomah County State of Oregon: John Miller, Thomas Day and James Miller citizens of the United States and residents of Skamania County State of Washington do hereby associate themselves together and form a body

ARTICLES OF CORPORATION OF THE WIND RIVER MILL AND
MERCANTILE COMPANY.

Polited and private corporation as follows:

(I).

The name of this corporation shall be The Wind River Mill and Mercantile Company.

(II).

The objects of this Corporation shall be:

(1). To buy, sell, lease, own and acquire such real and personal property as shall be necessary or convenient in the transaction of its business.

(2). To build construct and operate saw mills, planing mills, shingle mills and other factories in connection with the manufacture of lumber shingles and timber products.

(3). To lease, buy, sell, and use steamboats, scows and other vessels to be operate and navigate on the Columbia River from a point near the mouth of the Wind River in Skamania County State of Washington to other points on the Columbia and Willamette River and their tributaries.

(4). To construct or buy and operate a ferry and acquire a ferry franchise from the mouth of said Wind River to the opposite shore of the Columbia River in the State of Oregon.

(5). To cur, transport, buy and sell saw logs, shingle, bolts, shingles and other timber products in the state of Washington and other places.

(6) To cut drove and transport logs down Wind River to the mouth thereof and upon the Columbia River saw logs shingle bolts, lumber and other timber products.

(7). To clear out obstructions and straighten the channel by cutting across sand or gravel bars and constructing side dams and sheer booms in the said Wind River so as to enable the said Wind River to be used for floating driving and transporting saw logs, shingle bolts, lumber and other timber products thereon and to so improve said river as to enable the same to be used for the purpose of driving, floating, and transporting saw logs, shingle bolts, lumber and other timber products thereon.

(8). To buy, sell and deal in all sorts of merchandise farm products groceries, hardware, at the said mouth of Wind River in said state and at such other places in said State as they shall select.

(III).

The capital stock of the corporation shall be Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) divided into two hundred (200) shares of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) each.

(IV).

The trustees of this corporation who shall manage the concerns of the company for five months are: Bivn Ce Wiltse, John Backus, John Miller, Thomas Day and James Miller

The principal place of business of this corporation shall be located at William Murphus farm, in section 27 Township 3 Range 8 East in Skamania County, State of Washington.

The duration and existence of this corporation shall be fifty (50) years.
