Homestead Certificate No 2613 } To all to Whome these Present
Application 7662 } Shall come, Greeting:

Whereas there has been deposited in the general land office of the United States a certificate of the register of the land office at Vancouver Washington whereby it appears that pursuant to the act of congress approved 20th May 1862. to secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the Public domain and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Martin Feeney has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the south half of the North West quarter and the North half of the South West quarter of Section Seven in Township One North of Range five East of Willamette Meridian in Washington containing one hundred and fifty nine acres and seventy hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the general land office by the surveyor general;

Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Martin Feeney: the tract of land above described: to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Martin Feeney and to his heirs and assigns Forever; subject to any vested and accured water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein of lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by Law: and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

In Testimony Whereof I Benjamin Harrison President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the general land office to be hereunto affixed: Given under my hand, at the city of Washington the Twenty Fifth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety two. and of the independence of the United States: the one hundred and sevenieth
