

John Linsch to F. Briske & J. H. Hawley
 April 30, 1897

In consideration of the sum of Twenty-five Dollars this day in hand paid, the receipt of which I hereby acknowledge, I the undersigned, John Linsch do hereby agree to sell, transfer, and set over to F. Briske, and J. H. Hawley, by proper instrument of Conveyance clear of liens and one or any part of the following mineral claims herinafter described, of which I am the sole owner. Selections are to be made by said F. Briske, and J. H. Hawley, provided that F. Briske, and J. H. Hawley pay to me the sum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.) for the first one of the said mineral claims selected and the sum of One Hundred (\$100) for each and every other one of the said mineral claims selected. Said mineral claims from which selections are to be made are described as follows, to-wit:

"Bonanza Mineral Claim", Situated on Little Creek about five miles above the mouth of Canyon Creek.

"Robin Mineral Claim" Situated on Linn's River East fork about four miles above Canyon Creek, Bounded on the East by the "Goldmount Claim", Located April 7th, 1897 by John Linsch.

"Astoria Mineral Claim" Situated on Little Creek about five miles above the mouth of Canyon Creek, Located April 16, 1897 by John Linsch.

"Dickerson Mineral Claim" Bounded on the East by the Silver Mount Claim and on the North by the Robin, Located April 1897 by John Linsch.

"Blossman Mineral Claim" Situated on a small creek emptying into the Republican River about one-half of from the East fork of Linn's River.

located April 16th 1897 by John Lunsch,

"Monte Cristo Mineral Claim" Situated on a small creek emptying into the Republican creek about half mile from East fork of the Lewis River, located April 16th 1897 by John Lunsch,

"Portland Mineral Claim" Situated on the creek named Populist Creek about one-half mile from the mouth of later and about two miles from Lewis River, located April 9th 1897 by John Lunsch,

"The Jackson Mineral Claim" Beginning at the North center post of the Bonanza Claim bounded on the west by the Astoria and on the South by the Bonanza, located April 18th 1897 by John Lunsch,

"The Yellow Bay Mineral Claim" Situated about one-half mile from the mouth of Little Creek and bounded on the South by the Hope Claim and on the east by the Bonanza and on the North by the Astoria, and about one mile from the Venus, Mars and Hambledey Claims on Lewis River, located April 12th 1897 by John Lunsch,

"Monte Carlo Mineral Claim" This claim lies west of the Hope and South of the Chance, located April 16th 1897 by John Lunsch,

"Planet Mineral Claim" Bounded on the South by the Monte Cristo and on the East by the Bloomer and on the North by the Salmon, located on April 16th 1897 by John Lunsch,

"Chance Mineral Claim" Bounded on the West by the Hope and on the North by the Bonanza about 1/2 mile up Little Creek from Lewis River, located April 12th 1897 by John Lunsch,

"Mercury Mineral Claim" On Populist Creek about one-half mile from the mouth of Sand Creek, located April 18th 1897 by John Lunsch,

"Little Mineral Claim" (about 2000 feet south of the South Fork of Lewis River and bounded on the West by Monte Cristo and on the North by Bloomer. Located April 16th 1897 by John Lunsch

"Hope Mineral Claim" Situated on Little Creek about five miles above Canyon Creek tributary to the east fork of Lewis River. Located April 11th 1897 by John Lunsch Agent
