Homestead Certificate No 2307 } To all to whom these presents
Application 7785 } shall come, Greeting:

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862 "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John Vogel has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the

Fractional North West quarter of Section Nineteen, in Township two North of Range five East of Willamette Meridian in Washington, containing One Hundred and Sixty five acres and Twenty six hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General: Now know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said John Vogel the tract of land above described: To Have and To Hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereto, unto the said John Vogel and to his heirs and assigns forever: subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and right to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of Courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract ~~and~~ remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law, And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the Authority of the United States
