To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Homestead Certificate No 3842

Application 9610

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver Washington whereby it appears that pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th May 1862 "To secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Patsy Cardiff has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North East quarter of Section thirty six in Township three North of Range five East of Willamette Meridian in Washington, containing one and sixty acres. according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Patsy Cardiff the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Patsy Cardiff and to his heirs and assigns forever: subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural manufacturing or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of Courts and also subject to the right of a proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law. And there is reserved from the premises hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

In Testimony whereof I William McKinley President of the United States of America, have cause these letters to be made patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington the twenty-fourth day of February in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and twenty-second.
