## NOTICE OF LOCATION.

Notice is hereby given that we the undersigned citizens of the United States, claim fifteen hundred feet linear measure on this lode or vein of gold or silver bearing quartz. Commencing at this notice and monument and running Easterly therefrom along the line of the lode 50 feet to a stake marked East end center stake, and Westerly along the line of said lode a distance of 1500 feet to a stake marked Westerly end center stake, with the dips, spurs, and angles of said lode, together with the surface ground on each side of said lode, bounded and described as follows, to-wit: Commencing at the stake last named and running Northward therefrom at a right angle with the general direction of said lode, three hundred feet to a stake marked North corner stake; thence at a right angle East seven hundred and fifty feet to a stake marked north side center stake; thence East 750 feet to a stake marked N. Commencing at this notice and monument and running Easterly therefrom along the line of the lode 1500 feet to a stake marked Easterly end center stake and Westerly along the line of said lode a distance of 1500 feet to a stake marked Westerly end center stake with the dips, spurs and angles of said lode, together with the surface ground on each side of said lode, bounded and described as follows, to-wit: Commencing at the stake last named and running Northward therefrom at a right angle with the general direction of said lode three hundred feet to a stake marked N.
