ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

of the

WIND RIVER BOOM AND IMPROVEMENT CO.

Know all men by these presents, that Elver C. Wiltse a citizen of the United States and resident of Bridal Veil, Multnomah County, Oregon, John Backus a citizen of the United States resident of Portland, Multnomah County, State of Oregon, John Miller, Thomas Day and James Miller citizens of the United States and residents of Skamania County, Washington, do hereby associate themselves together and form a body politic and private corporation as follows.

I.

The name of this corporation shall be The Wind River Boom and Improvement Co.

II.

The object of said corporation shall be (1). To buy, sell, lease acquire, appropriate, and condemn such real estate property as shall be necessary and convenient for such corporation to have in its business. (2nd) To construct, maintain and use booms, dolphins, piles, piers, or such other structures as shall be necessary or convenient for the carrying on the business of said corporation in the Columbia River at and near the mouth of Wind River in the County of Skamania, State of Washington and to construct, maintain and use all necessary spurs or receiving booms, dolphins piles of other structures in said river at said point and in said Wind River at and near its mouth and for a distance up said river such as shall be necessary or convenient to carry the business of said company.

(3rd) To buy, sell, own, operate construct and maintain such steamboat or vessel as shall be necessary, or convenient for the said Company in its business of constructing, operating and maintaining said boom at said points.

(4th) To maintain and use said booms, piles, dolphins, piers and structures and real estate in the said rivers in receiving, catching, booming, sorting, separating, holding, keeping, storing and delivering for toll and hire and otherwise, saw logs, lumber, timber, shingle bolts, and all kinds of timber products that may be rafted, driven, floated or transported down said rivers.

(5th) To operate such steamboat vessel or ferry as shall be necessary or convenient for said Company to in its said business from the mouth of said Wind River across the Columbia River at the nearest practical point opposite thereto.

III.

The amount of the capital stock of the Corporation shall be Twenty thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) consisting of two hundred (200) shares of the par value of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) each.

The duration and existence of this corporation shall be fifty years (50).

V.

There shall be five (5) Trustees of said Corporation who shall manage the concerns of this Company for five months to-wit: Elver C. Wiltse, John Backus, John Miller, Thomas Day and James Miller.

VI.

The principal place of business of this Corporation shall be located at William Murpys farm in Section 27 Township 3 North R. 6 East in Skamania County, State of Washington.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE WIND RIVER MILL AND MERCANTILE COMPANY.

Know all men by these presents, That Biver C. Wiltse a citizen of the United States and resident of Bridal Veil, Multnomah County, State of Oregon, John Backus, a citizen of the United States and resident of Portland, Multnomah County, State of Oregon; John Miller, Thomas Day and James Miller citizens of the United States and residents of Skamania County, State of Washington, do hereby associate themselves together and form a body politic and private Corporation as follows:

I.

The name of this corporation shall be The Wind River Mill and Mercantile Company.

(1st) To buy, sell, lease, own and acquire such real and personal property as shall be necessary or convenient in the transaction of its business.

II.

(2nd) To build, construct and operate saw mills, planing mills, shingle mills and other factories in connection with the manufacture of lumber, shingles and timber products.

(3rd) To lease, buy, and use steamboats, scows and other vessels to be operated and navigate on the Columbia River from a point near the mouth of Wind River in Skamania County, State of Washington, to other points on the Columbia and Willamette Rivers and their tributaries.

(4th) To construct or buy and operate a ferry and acquire a ferry franchise from the mouth of said Wind River to the opposite shore of the Columbia River in the State of Oregon.

(5th) To cut, transport, buy and sell saw logs, shingle bolts, shingles and other timber products in the State of Washington and other places.

(6th) To cut, drive and transport logs down Wind River to the mouth thereof and upon the Columbia River saw logs, shingle bolts, lumber and other timber products.

(7th) To clear out obstructions and straighten the channel by cutting across sand or gravel bars and constructing side dams and sheer booms in the said Wind River so as to enable the said Wind River to be used for floating, driving and transporting saw logs, shingle bolts, lumber and other timber products thereon and to improve said river as to enable
