

Beginning at a hemlock tree on the center of the lode marked North end center of Columbia claim and running fifteen hundred (1500) linear feet in a Southerly direction along the lode to a stake marked South end center of Columbia claim and taking three hundred (300) linear feet on each side of the center of said lode the entire distance of fifteen hundred (1500) linear feet and including said lode with all its angles, spurs and dips. LOCATION OF UNDERWOOD NO. 1. MINE.
