

United States to Elsie V. Oatman
 Certificate No. 4013 The United States of America.

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas Elsie V. Oatman of Multnomah County, Oregon has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver Washington whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Elsie V. Oatman according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the South East quarter of the North West quarter and the North East quarter of the South East quarter of Section twelve in Township two north of range five east of Willamette Meridian in Washington containing eighty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Elsie V. Oatman. Now know ye, That the United States of America in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Elsie V. Oatman and to her heirs, the said tracts above described; To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Elsie V. Oatman and to her and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate to interest the premises hereby granted, as provided by law; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed

In testimony whereof J. Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
