The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Homestead Certificate No. 3919 }
Application 10559 } Whereas There has been deposited
in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate
of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver Washington, where-
by it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved
20th May, 1862: "To secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Pub-
lic Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of
Charles Russell has been established and duly consummated,
in conformity to law, for the North West quarter of Section
thirty five in Township four North of Range seven East
of Willamette Meridian in Washington, containing one hun-
dred and sixty acres.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said
Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor
General:

Now know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the
United States unto the said Charles Russell the tract of
Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract
of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Charles
Russell and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to
any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural,
manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and
reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may
be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws,
and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the pro-
prietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore there-
from, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect
the premises hereby granted, as provided by law. And there
is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of ^{way} thereon
for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United
States.

In testimony whereof I, William McKinley, President
of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be
made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to

be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the fourth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and twenty third.
