

United States to Frank H. Shaw

The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:
 Homestead Certificate No. 4596 }
 Application 9764 } Whereas There has been de-
 posited in the General Land Office of the United States
 a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Van-
 couver, Washington, whereby it appears that, pursuant to
 the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure
 Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain,"
 and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Frank
 H. Shaw has been established and duly consummated,
 in conformity to law, for the

South half of the North West quarter and the South
 half of the North East quarter of Section ten in Town-
 ship three North of Range nine East of Willamette Meri-
 dian in Washington, containing one hundred and sixty
 acres,
 according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land,
 returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor
 General:

Now know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the
 United States unto the said Frank H. Shaw the tract of
 Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract
 of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Frank
 H. Shaw and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to
 any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultur-
 al, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches
 and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may
 be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and
 decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the propri-
 etor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore there-
 from, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the
 premises hereby granted, as provided by law. And there is re-
 served from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for
 ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

In testimony whereof I, William McKinley, President

of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the twenty fifth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and twenty-fourth
