The United States of America,
 Certificate } To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:
 No. 3299 } Whereas John E. Johnson of Skamania County,
 Washington Territory has deposited in the General Land
 Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register
 of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington Territory,
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by
 the said John E. Johnson according to the provisions of the
 Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act
 making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands,"
 and the acts supplemental thereto, for the

Lots numbered one and two and the South half
 of the North East quarter of Section two in Township two
 North of Range six East of Willamette Meridian in
 Washington Territory, containing one hundred and sixty one
 acres and seventy four hundredths of an acre
 according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said
 Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Survey-
 or General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said
 John E. Johnson.

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in
 consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the
 several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided,
 have given and granted, and by these presents do give and
 grant, unto the said John E. Johnson and to his heirs,
 the said Tract above described: To have and to hold the
 same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities,
 and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging,
 unto the said John E. Johnson and to his heirs and assigns
 forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for
 mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes,
 and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection
 with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknow-
 ledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and
 also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode
 to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same

be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

In Testimony whereof, I Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
