To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office of Vancouver Washington Territory, whereby it appears that pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto the claim of John W. Stevenson has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South East quarter of the South East quarter of Section nine, the West half of the Southwest quarter of Section ten, the lot numbered one of Section fifteen and the lot numbered four of Section sixteen, in Township one north of Range five east, in district of lands, subject to sale at Vancouver, Washington Territory, containing one hundred seventy one acres and seventy five hundredths of an acre (Excess paid as per Receipt No 26) according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John W. Stevenson, the tract of Land above described:

To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John W. Stevenson and to his heirs and assigns forever

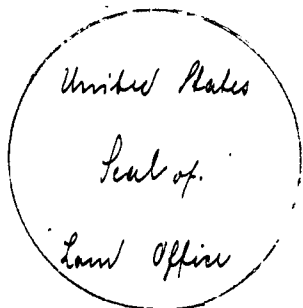
In testimony whereof, J. M. Grant, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
