

United States to Vincenzo Ricchinto

The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Homestead Certificate No. 4104 }
Application 7681 . } Whereas There has been deposited in the General
Land Office of the United States a certificate of The Register of the Land
Office at Vancouver, Washington whereby it appears that, pursuant to the
Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862. "To secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers
on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of
Vincenzo Ricchinto has been established and duly consummated, in con-
formity to law, for the South West quarter of the South East quarter of
Section three, in Township one North, of Range five East of Hellamette
Meridian in Washington, containing forty acres, according to the Official
Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land
Office by the Surveyor General.

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United
States unto the said Vincenzo Ricchinto the tract of land above described:
To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances
thereof, unto the said Vincenzo Ricchinto and to his heirs and assigns
forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining,
agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches
and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be
recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions
of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode
to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to
penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.
And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon
for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

In Testimony Whereof, I, William McKinley, President of the United
States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent and the seal
of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the seventeenth
day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety
nine, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and twenty third.
