

United States to Albert S. Estabrook.

The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:  
 Homestead Certificate No. 1374 }  
 Application 3001 } Whereas There has been  
 deposited in the General Land Office of the United  
 States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office  
 at Vancouver Washington Territory, whereby it appears that,  
 pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862,  
 "To secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Do-  
 main," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of  
 Albert S. Estabrook has been established and duly con-  
 summated, in conformity to law, for the

South East quarter of the South East quarter  
 of Section twenty, and the South West quarter of the  
 South West quarter of Section twenty-one, the North West  
 quarter of the North West quarter of Section twenty-eight  
 and the North East quarter of the North East quarter  
 of Section twenty-nine in Township three North of Range  
 eight East of Willamette Meridian in Washington Terri-  
 tory, containing One hundred and sixty acres.  
 according to the Official Plat. of the Survey of the said Land,  
 returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor Gen-  
 eral:

Now know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the  
 United States unto the said Albert S. Estabrook the tract  
 of Land above described: To have and to hold the said  
 tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the  
 said Albert S. Estabrook and to his heirs and assigns  
 forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights  
 for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other  
 purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in  
 connection with such water rights, as may be recognized  
 and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and de-  
 cisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the pro-  
 prietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore  
 therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or in-

intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

In testimony whereof J. Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
