

The United States "to" Harry G. Ankeny

To all to whom these presents shall come
Greeting: Whereas Harry G. Ankeny junior of Ska-
mania County, Washington, has deposited in the Gen-
eral Land Office of the United States a Certificate
of the register of the Land Office at Vancouver-Washing-
ton, whereby it appears that full payment has
been made by the said Harry G. Ankeny junior
according to the provisions of the act of Congress
of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making
further provision for the sale of the Public Lands,"
and the acts supplemental thereto, for

The fractional North East quarter of Section seven-
teen in Township two North of Range five East of Will-
amette Meridian in Washington containing One hundred
and sixty one acres and eighty five hundredths of
an acre

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of
the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office
by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been
purchased by the said Harry G. Ankeny junior

Now know ye, That the United States of America
in consideration of the premises, and in conformity
with the several acts of Congress in such case
made and provided, have given and granted, and
by these presents do give and grant, unto the said
Harry G. Ankeny junior and to his heirs, the said
tract above described: To have and to hold the same
together with all the rights, privileges, immunities,
and appurtenances of what-soever nature, therunto be-
longing, unto the said Harry G. Ankeny junior and
to his heirs and assigns forever: Subject to any
vested and accrued water rights for mining, agri-
cultural, manufacturing or other purposes, and rights
to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such
water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged

by the local customs, laws; and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted as provided by law; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

these letters to be made Patent, and the seal
of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and ninety two and of the independence
