Whereas, There has been deposited, in the general Land Office, of the United States a certificate, numbered, One, of the Register and Receiver at Vancouver, Washington Territory, whereby, it appears, that under the provisions of the act of Congress, approved the 27th day of September 1850, entitled An Act to create the office of Surveyor General, of the Public Lands in Oregon, and to provide for the survey, and to make donations to settlers of the said public Lands, and the legislation supplemental thereto the claim of George W. Johnson of Skamania County Washington Territory Notification No 301, has been established to a donation of One Half Section, or Three Hundred and Twenty Acres of Land, and that the same has been surveyed, and designeatd, as claim number Thirty Eight, being parts of Sections, Seventeen, Twenty, Twenty One, and Twenty official plat of Nine, in Township Two, North of Range Seven East, according to the survey returned tothe General Land Office, by the surveyor General, being bounded and described as follows, to wit. Beginning at the corner to fractional Sections Twenty and Twenty Nine on the North Bank of the Columbia River, where the South line of the South East quarter, of said section intersects said river, and running thence with the meanders of said river, North, Sixty three degrees.
