Now, Know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the provisions of the Act aforesaid, Have given, and granted, and by these presents, Do give and grant, unto the said George W. Johnson, and to his heirs, the tract of land above described, but hereby expressly reserving to the United States, and its assignees the right to remove the buildings erected thereon by the Government

To have and to hold the said tract, with the appurtenances, unto the said George W. Johnson, and to his heirs and assigns forever, with the reservation of the right of the United States or its assignees to remove the buildings erected thereon by the Government as aforesaid

In testimony whereof, I, Andrew Johnson President of the United States, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed,
