 notice is hereby given that Henry Hansen of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a lot of saw logs and logs, being about 2,000,000 feet of fir saw-logs for lumber and about 400,000 feet of hemlock logs for pulp, in quantity, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington the fir logs being marked thus "S" on end and "W" on side of each log, and the hemlock logs thus "H" on end and "V" on side, and said fir and hemlock logs are now lying in the Washougal River in that part of said river lying and being in township number two, north of range five east of the Willamette Meridian, in said Skamania County, being between the Washougal Land and Logging Company's dam in said river and the chute therein and in and near said dam and in said river as aforesaid, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in barking said logs and working on skid road over which said logs were hauled and attending to the rigging used in obtaining and securing said logs; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is the Washougal Land and Logging Company (a corporation); that the Portland Savings Bank and O. N. Denny as Receiver of the Portland Savings Bank, of Portland, Oregon have, or claim to have, some interest therein; that the said Washougal Land and Logging Company, through its president, agent and manager, J. M. Buckley, employed said Henry Hansen to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to wit:

The said Washougal Land and Logg

-ging Company, acting through its said
 president, manager and agent, J. A.
 Buckley, agreed to pay the said Henry
 Hansen the sum of \$26⁰⁰ per month from
 May 8, 1895, to June 1, 1895, and the sum
 of \$30⁰⁰ per month from said June 1st to
 September 18, 1895, and furnish board
 and lodging free of charge, for such labor
 and assistance, that said contract has
 been faithfully performed and fully com-
 plied with on the part of the said Henry
 Hansen, who performed labor upon and
 assisted in backing and attending rigging
 and in obtaining and securing said logs
 for the period of 82 ¹/₄ days, to-wit; 15 days
 at \$26⁰⁰ per month and 67 ³/₄ days at
 \$30⁰⁰ per month; that said labor and
 assistance were so performed and ren-
 dered upon the said logs between the
 7th day of May 1895, and the 18th day of
 September, 1895; and the rendition of said
 service was closed on the evening of the
 17th day of September, 1895 and thirty days
 have not elapsed since that time; that
 the amount of claimant's demand for
 said service is the sum of \$89⁸⁵; that
 no part thereof has been paid except the
 sum of \$52⁸⁰; and there is now due and
 remaining unpaid thereon, after deduct-
 ing all just credits and offsets, the sum
 of \$37⁰⁵, in which amount he claims a lien
 upon said saw-logs and logs. The said
 Henry Hansen also claims a lien on all
 said saw-logs and logs now owned
 by said Washougal Land and Logging
 Company of said County, the said

Portland Savings Bank, and the said
O. A. Denny as Receiver of the Portland
Savings Bank, and each of them, to
secure payment for the work and labor
performed in obtaining or securing the
said saw-logs and Logs herein described.
