

Washougal Land & Logging Co. to Frank Temple

 Notice is hereby given that Frank Temple of Skamania County, State of Washington claims a lien upon a lot of fir saw-logs for lumber, being about 2,200,000 feet in quantity, and a lot of hemlock logs for pulp, being about 500,000 feet in quantity, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington the fir logs being marked thus "B" on end and "WW" on side and the hemlock thus "H" on end and "VI" on side of each log, and said fir and hemlock logs are now lying in the Washougal River in that part of said river lying and being in Township number two, North of range five East of the Willamette Meridian, in said Skamania County, being between the Washougal Land and Logging Company's dam in said river and the chute therein and in and near said dam, and in said river as aforesaid, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in barking and swamping and obtaining and securing said saw-logs and logs; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is the Washougal Land and Logging Company, a corporation; that the Portland Savings Bank, and O. N. Denny as Receiver of the Portland Savings Bank, of Portland Oregon, have a claim to have some interest therein; that the said Washougal Land and Logging Company, through its president, manager and agent, J. A. Buckley, employed said Frank Temple to perform such labor and render such

assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

The said Washougal Land and Logging Company, acting through its said President agent and manager, J. A. Buckley, agreed to pay the said Frank Temple the sum of one dollar per day from April 7, 1895 to July 1, 1895 and the sum of \$30⁰⁰ per month from said July 1st to September 7, 1895 and furnish board and lodging free of charge, for such labor and assistance; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said Frank Temple, who performed labor upon and assisted in barking and sawing said logs and saw-logs for the period of 101 days to-wit, 45 days at \$1⁰⁰ per day and 56 days at \$30⁰⁰ per month; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said saw-logs and logs between 6th day of April, 1895, and the 8th day of September, 1895; and the rendition of said service was closed on the evening of the 7th day of September, 1895 and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said service is \$109⁰⁰; that no part thereof has been paid except \$58⁰⁰ and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$51⁰⁰ in which amount the claimant has a lien upon said saw-logs and logs. The said Frank Temple also claims a lien on all said saw-logs and logs now owned by said Washougal Land

and Logging Company of said County,
the said Portland Savings Bank, and
the said O N Denny as Receiver of the
Portland Savings Bank, and each of
them, to secure payment for the work
and labor performed in obtaining or
securing the said saw logs and logs
herein described
