

Loggers' Lien of William E. Ramsey

William E. Ramsey, claimant

vs

The Washougal Land and Logging Company (a corporation),
The Portland Savings Bank, and
O. K. Denny as Receiver of Portland Savings Bank

Notice is hereby given that William E. Ramsey of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a lot of fir saw logs, being about 2,200,000 in quantity, and a lot of hemlock logs, being about 500,000 feet in quantity, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, the fir logs being marked thus "S" on end and "W W" on side and the hemlock logs thus "H" on end and "V" on side of each log, and said fir and hemlock logs are now lying in the Washougal River, in that part of said river lying and being in Township number two, north range five east of the Willamette Meridian, in said Skamania County, being between the Washougal Land and Logging Company's dam in said river and the chute therein and in and about near said dam, and in said river as aforesaid and scattered along said river in the woods, for the labor performed upon and assistance rendered in sawing and cutting and obtaining and securing said saw logs and logs; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is the Washougal Land and Logging Company (a corporation); that the Portland Savings Bank, and O. K. Denny as Receiver of the Portland Savings Bank, of Portland, Oregon, have, or claim to have, some interest therein; that the said Washougal Land and Logging Company by

its duly authorized and constituted president, manager and agent, J. A. Buckley, employed said William E. Ramsey to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

The said Washougal Land and Logging Company, by its said duly authorized and constituted president, manager and agent, J. A. Buckley, agreed to pay the said William E. Ramsey for such labor and assistance the sum of \$40.⁰⁰ per month and furnish board and lodging free of charge; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said William E. Ramsey, who performed labor upon and assisted in sawing and cutting said saw-logs and logs for the period of 48 1/2 days that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said saw-logs and logs between the 25th day of July 1895 and the 27th day of September 1895; and the rendition of said service was closed on the evening of the 26th day of September 1895, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said service is \$68.⁰⁵; that no part thereof has been paid except \$1.⁰⁵, and there is now due, and remaining unpaid thereon after deducting all just credits and offsets the sum of \$67.⁰⁰, in which amount he claims a lien upon said saw-logs and logs. The said Washougal Land and Logging Company, William E. Ramsey also claims a lien on all said saw-logs and logs now

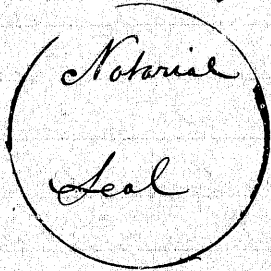

Denny as Receiver of the said Portland Savings Bank, and each of them, to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing the saw-logs and logs herein described
