

Logging Lien of William Lane

William Lane, Claimant

vs

The Washougal Land and
Logging Company (a corporation)
The Portland Savings Bank and
O. K. Denny, as Receiver of the
Portland Savings Bank.

Notice is hereby given that William Lane of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a lot of fir saw logs, being about 2,200,000 feet in quantity, and a lot of hemlock logs, being about 500,000 feet in quantity which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, the fir logs being marked thus "S" on end and "WW" on side and the hemlock logs thus "H" on end and "V" on side of each log, and said fir and hemlock logs are now lying in the Washougal River, in that part of said river lying and being in township number two, north of range four east of the Willamette River meridian, in said Skamania County, lying between the Washougal Land and Logging Company's dam in said river and the chute therein and in and near said dam and in said river as aforesaid and scattered in the woods along and near the bank of said river for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in sawing and cutting and obtaining and securing said saw-logs and logs; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is the Washougal Land and Logging Company (a corporation); that the Portland Savings Bank and O. K. Denny as Receiver of said the Portland Savings Bank, of Portland, Oregon,

have, or claim to have, some interest therein. That the said Washougal Land and Logging Company, by its duly authorized and constituted president, manager and agent J. A. Buckley, employed said William Lane to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

The said Washougal Land and Logging Company, by its said duly authorized and constituted president, manager and agent J. A. Buckley, agreed to pay the said William Lane for such labor and assistance the sum of \$26.⁰⁰ per month from April 25, 1895 to May 1, 1895, the sum of \$30.⁰⁰ per month from said May 1st to July 1, 1895, ~~the sum of \$30.⁰⁰ per~~ and \$35.⁰⁰ from said July 1st to September 17, 1895. and furnish board and lodging free of charge; that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said William Lane, who performed labor upon and assisted in cutting sawing, obtaining and securing said saw-logs and logs for the period of 114 ¹/₂ days, to-wit, 4 days at \$26.⁰⁰ per month, 54 days at \$30.⁰⁰, 5 ¹/₂ days at \$35.⁰⁰ that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said saw-logs and logs between the 24th day of April, 1895, and the 17th day of September 1895, and the rendition of said service was closed on the 16th day of September 1895, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said service, is \$137.⁰¹, that no part thereof has been paid except \$27.⁸⁰ and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum

of \$109²¹, in which amount he claims a lien upon said saw-logs and logs. The said William Lane also claims a lien on all said saw-logs and logs now owned by said Washington Land and Logging Company of said county, the said Portland Savings Bank, and the said A. N. Denny as Receiver of the said Portland Savings Bank, and each of them, to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing the said saw-logs and logs heresh described.

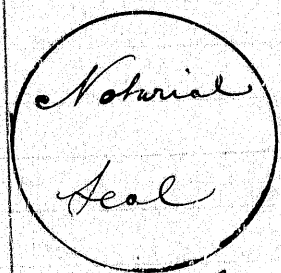
