

Washougal Land Logging and ^{others} to Thomas C. Terison

^{Thomas C. Terison, claiming}
^{the Washougal Land and Logging Company (a corporation)}
^{of which C. H. Denny was Receiver of the Portland Savings Bank}
 Notice is hereby given that Thomas C. Terison, of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a lot of fir saw-logs being about 2,200,000 feet, in quantity, and a lot of hemlock logs, being about 500,000 feet in quantity, which were cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington the fir-logs being marked thus "S" on end and "WV" on side and the hemlock logs thus "H" on end and "vi" on side of each log and said fir and hemlock logs are now lying in the Washougal River in that part of said river lying and being in Township number two, north of range five east of the Willamette Meridian, in said Skamania County, being between the Washougal Land and Logging Company's dam in said river and the chute therein and in and near said dam, and in said river as aforesaid for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in barking, sawing and felling said saw-logs and working on skid road over which same were hauled; that the name of the owner or reputed owner is the Washougal Land and Logging Company (a corporation); that the Portland Savings Bank and C. H. Denny as Receiver of the Portland Savings Bank, of Portland, Oregon, have, or claim to have, some interest therein; that the said Washougal Land and Logging Company, by its duly authorized and constituted president, manager and agent, J. A. Buckley, employed said Thomas C. Terison to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit: The said Washougal Land and Logging Company, acting through its said president

agent and manager J. C. Buckley, agreed to pay the said Thomas C. Terison for such labor and assistance the sum of \$26⁰⁰ per month from July 17, 1895, to August 1, 1895 and the sum of \$30⁰⁰ per month from said August 1st to September, 18, 1895, and furnish board and lodging free of charge, that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said Thomas C. Terison, who performed labor upon and assisted in sawing, felling and barking and securing said saw-logs and logs for the period of 48 1/2 days, to wit, 10 days at \$26⁰⁰ per month and 38 1/2 days at \$30⁰⁰ per month; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said saw-logs and logs between the 16th day of July 1895, and the 18th day of September 1895, and the rendition of said service was closed on the evening of the 17th day of September 1895, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said service is \$54²² 2/3; that no part thereof has been paid except \$12⁸⁰ and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all credits and offsets, the sum of \$41⁴² 2/3, in which amount he claims a lien upon said saw-logs and logs now owned by said Washougal Land and Logging Company of said county, the said Portland Savings Bank, and the said O. N. Denny as Receiver of the said Portland Savings Bank and each of them, to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining or securing the said saw-logs and logs herein described.
