Notice is hereby given, that J. Calbeton of Multnomah County, State of Oregon, claims a lien upon a lot of fir and hemlock saw-logs, being about 3,500,000 feet in quantity, which were cut in Skamania County, State of Washington, are marked thus: The fir logs marked "8" (Dollar stamp), also water marked "WV"; hemlock logs marked "H" (stamp) also water marked "VI" and are now lying in the Washougal river in Skamania and Clarke Counties between a point where the East line of Section 11, T. 2. N. R. 5 E, W. 1/2 in Skamania Co; Wash crosses said river in Skamania County and the mouth of said river in Clarke County, and also some logs in the woods in Skamania County, being about 400,000 feet, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in hauling and manufacturing said logs as beamster in said logging camp; That the name of the owners or reputed owners is the Washougal Land and Logging Company (a corporation), and the Portland Savings Bank, O. H. Denny, Receiver, has o. claims to have some interest as owners therein.

That said Washougal Land and Logging Company by J. C. Buckley its President and Managing Agent, who was duly authorized so to do, employed said J. Calbeton to perform such labor and render such assistance, upon the following terms and conditions to-wit:

The said Washougal Land and Logging Company (a corporation) by and through J. C. Buckley, its President and Managing Agent, agreed to pay,

said J. Culbertson for such labor and assistance as steamer the agreed price of \$60⁰⁰ per month for 103 days work and labor as steamer during the months of May, June, July, August and September, 1895, amounting to Two Hundred and ~~thirty~~ seven $\frac{7}{100}$. That said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said J. Culbertson who performed labor upon and assisted in hauling said logs as steamer for the period of One Hundred and three (103) days. That said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said logs between the 5th day of May, 1895, and the 26th day of September 1895 and the rendition of said services was closed on the 26th day of September 1895 and thirty days have not elapsed since that time. That the amount of claimant's demand for said services is Two Hundred and thirty-seven $\frac{7}{100}$ \$237 $\frac{7}{100}$ Dollars, that no part thereof has been paid, except, fifty-nine $\frac{75}{100}$ (\$59.75) Dollars and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of One Hundred and seventy-seven $\frac{36}{100}$ (\$177 $\frac{36}{100}$) Dollars in which amount he claims a lien upon said logs

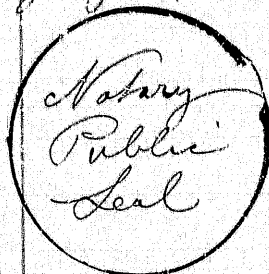
