

Loggers Lien of Chas Grant

Notice is hereby given, that Chas Grant, of Multnomah County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a lot of fir and hemlock saw-logs, being about 3,500,000 feet in quantity, which were cut in Skamania County, State of Washington, are marked thus: the fir logs marked "S" (Dollar Stamp) also water marked "W. V. I."; hemlock logs marked "H" (stamp) also water marked "V. I." and are now lying in the Washougal river in Skamania and Clarke counties between a point where the East line of Section 11, T 2 N 5 E. W. N. W. in Skamania Co. Wash, crosses said river in Skamania County and the mouth of said river in Clarke County, and also some logs in the woods in Skamania County, being about 400,000 feet, for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in cutting and manufacturing said logs as barker in bartering above logs.

That the name of the owners or reputed owners is the Washougal Land and Logging Company (a corporation), and the Portland Savings Bank, O. C. Denny receiver, has or claims to have some interest as owners therein.

That said Washougal Land and Logging Company, by J. A. Buckley its President and Managing agent, who was duly authorized so to do, employed said Chas Grant to perform such labor and render such assistance, upon the following terms and conditions to-wit:

The said Washougal Land and Logging Company (a corporation) by and through J. A. Buckley

its President and Managing Agent, agreed to pay said Chas Grant for such labor and assistance as Barker \$30⁰⁰ per month for all work done in April and May 17 days, and \$35⁰⁰ per month for all work done in June, July, August and September 75½ days work and labor in 1895. That said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said Chas Grant who performed labor upon and assisted in cutting and manufacturing said logs for the period of ninety four ½ days (94½). That said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said logs between the 29th day of April and the 9th day of September 1895 and the rendition of said services was closed on the 9th day of September, 1895, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time. That the amount of claimant's demand for said services is One hundred twenty three 18/100 (\$123 18/100) Dollars, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of Seventy four 08/100 (\$74.08) Dollars, in which amount he claims a lien upon said logs.
