

Lizzie Appendahl vs C. B. Williams.

Notice is hereby given that Lizzie Appendahl, of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon the franchise, earnings and all the real and personal property of C. B. Williams, which is used in the operation of his said saw mill, lumber and timber business, in Skamania County, Washington, to the extent of the moneys due him from said C. B. Williams, operating said franchise & business, for labor performed in and about said C. B. Williams' sawmill as hereinafter set forth.

That the said property of the said C. B. Williams upon which the claimant herein claims a lien is situated as follows, to-wit: Upon a certain wooden building — feet by — feet in size, situated on the North west quarter of Section Thirty-five, Township Three North, Range Seven East, Willamette Meridian, in Skamania County, Washington, and used as a sawmill building by the said C. B. Williams; also upon the steam boilers and engines, sawmill machinery, pulleys, belting, shafts, saws, chairs, tools and any and all machinery and tools connected with or in any manner used in and about the said sawmill building, so situated as aforesaid; also upon any and all lumber, timbers or ties of whatever nature or description now lying and being in the mill yard of said sawmill.

This lien is claimed for work and labor performed and assistance rendered by the claimant for the said C. B. Williams, as book, in the operation of said sawmill, lumber and timber business, in Skamania County, Washington.

That the name of the owner or reputed owner is C. B. Williams and Thomas Cornell has or claims to have some interest as owner therein.

That said C. B. Williams, by F. B. Clark, his agent and manager, employed said Lizzie Appendahl, to perform such labor and render such assistance on the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

That the said C. B. Williams, by and through F. B. Clark, his agent and manager, agreed to pay said Lizzie Appendahl for such labor and assistance the sum of \$66 $\frac{2}{3}$ —cts per day and board for all work and labor performed.

That said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of the said Lizzie Appendahl, who performed labor in the sawmill at said sawmill for the period of 20 days.

That said labor and assistance were so performed and

rendered in said ~~several~~ messhouse between the 12 day of May, 1900, and the 30 day of May, 1900, and the rendition of said services were closed on the 30 day of May, 1900, and ninety days have not elapsed since that time. That the amount of claimant's demand for said services is Thirteen $\frac{33}{100}$ (\$13.33) Dollars; that no part thereof has been paid, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon, after deducting all first credits and offsets, the sum of Thirteen $\frac{33}{100}$ (\$13.33) Dollars, in which amount the claimant herein claims a lien upon the property of the said E. B. Williams hereinafter fully described.
