

Location of the 'Happy' Mine

Notice of Location of Quartz claim

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, a citizen of the United States over the age of twenty-one years on the Eighteenth day of September 1896 discovered a vein or lode of Quartz in place bearing gold Silver and Lead within the limits of the claim hereby located and have this Eighteenth day of September 1896 under and in accordance with the Revised Statutes of the United States located fifteen hundred linear feet of this vein or lode in length with surface ground three hundred feet in width on each side of the center of said lode situated in the Bald Mountain Mining District County of Bannock and State of Washington and known as the 'Happy' Mining claim and extending fifteen hundred feet to and from this notice at the discovery or prospect shaft; the exterior boundaries of this claim being distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments and more particularly described as follows to wit: About four hundred (400) feet South West from this notice of discovery a high cliff about seventy (70) feet high also on a cliff about 70 feet high being the place of discovery. Beginning at discovery and running 300 feet North East to corner post thence 100 feet South Easterly to corner post thence South West 300 feet to center end post thence 300 feet to South West corner post thence 100 feet North Westerly to corner post thence 300 feet North east to the place of beginning and that I intend to hold and work said above described claim as provided by the local laws and the customs and rules of miners and mining statutes and laws of the United States
