Notice of Location

To Whom it May Concern

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned is a citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty one year, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did on the 9th day of September A. D. 1896, locate and by this notice do hereby locate a Quartz Claim known as the Silver Bell Lode or Mining Claim said claim having been discovered the 9th day of September 1896 and do claim (of) three hundred linear feet in this lead, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by one hundred feet in width the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries, situated in Cedar Creek Dist. County of Skamania State of Washington said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:—

Commencing at discovery stk thence running Westing 25 ft to S Westery center stk thence 300 feet to S Westery corner stk thence 150 feet to W Westery cor stk thence 300 ft to W Eastery cor stk thence 150 ft to S Eastery cor stk thence 300 ft to S Westery center stk

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rule of Miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Washington
