AND DECISIONS OF COURTS, AND ALSO SUBJECT TO THE RIGHT OF THE PROPRIETOR OF A VEIN

OR LODE TO EXTRACT AND REMOVE HIS ORE THEREFROM, SHOULD THE SAME BE FOUND TO PEN
ETRATE OR INTERSECT THE PREMISES HEREBY GRANTED, AS PROVIDED BY LAW; AND THERE IS
