

Location of the Lewis Mine by John R. Cole.

Notice of Location

To Whom it May Concern

Notice is hereby given, that I John R. Cole, a Citizen of the United States of America, under the age of twenty-two years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six Title thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did, on the 17 day of Sept AD 1896, locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a lode claim, known as the Lewis Lode or Mining Claim said claim having been discovered the 17 day of Sept. 1896, and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on the lead, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries) (twenty acres of mining ground) situated in Copper Creek Dist. County of Skamania State of Wash. said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural object or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows to-wit:

The claim is described as follows. It is an extension on the Big Cliphont, running 1500 feet North by 10 degrees East and 300 hundred feet each way from center. This claim begins at the North end of the Big Cliphont.

And I intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and the mining laws of the United States and of the State of Wash.
