Notice is hereby given that E. A. Learned of Skamania County, State of Washington, claims a lien upon a lot of fir cord wood, being about four hundred and fifty cords in quantity, which was cut or manufactured in Skamania County, State of Washington, as marked thus - no mark, and 150 cords of said wood are now lying in the South East Quarter of the South East Quarter of Section Twenty-four, Township Three North of Rwy, Seven East of the Tlle. Mer. 150 cords thereof are now lying in Lots five and eight in Section 25, Township Three North, Range $7\frac{1}{2}$ East of the Tlle. Mer. and also about 150 cords of said wood are now lying in or near the wharf on the Columbia River in Lots 15 in Section 26, Town. 3 North Range $7\frac{1}{2}$ East of the T.M. in Skamania County, Wash. for labor performed upon and assistance rendered in hauling, obtaining, securing and fluming said cordwood: that the name of the owner or reputed owner is J. D. Crawford, that J. D. Crawford employed said E. A. Learned to perform such labor and render such assistance upon the following terms and conditions, to-wit:

That said J. D. Crawford agreed to pay the said E. A. Learned for such labor and assistance 25 cents of 50 cords and 30 cents for 204 cords, and \$4.00 per day for $5\frac{3}{4}$ days work: that said contract has been faithfully performed and fully complied with on the part of said E. A. Learned, who performed labor upon and assisted in hauling, obtaining, securing and fluming said cordwood, for the period of 3 mos and 26 days; that said labor and assistance were so performed and rendered upon said cordwood between the 1st day of February, 1900, and the 26th day of May, 1900; and the rendition of said service was closed on the 26th day of May, 1900, and thirty days have not elapsed since that time; that the amount of claimant's demand for said service is \$96.70; that no part thereof has been paid except \$40.00, and there is now due and remaining unpaid thereon after deducting all just credits and offsets, the sum of \$56.70, in which amount he claims a lien upon the said cordwood. The said E. A. Learned also claims a lien on all said cordwood now owned by said J. D. Crawford of said County and State to secure payment for the work and labor performed in obtaining & securing the said cordwood herein described.
