

Notice of Location.

To Whom it May Concern:

Notice is hereby given, that we, Charles W. Bigham and C. Cole, a citizen of the United States of America, over the age of twenty-one years, having complied with the requirements of Chapter Six of Title Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and of all other mining laws thereof, and of the State of Washington, and the local customs, laws, rules and regulations of miners, did, on the 10th day of September, A.D., 1896, locate, and by this notice do hereby locate a Quartz Claim, known as the "Magic E" Lode or Mining Claim, having been discovered the 10th day of September 1896, and do claim (fifteen hundred linear feet on this lode, lode or vein bearing mineral in place, by six hundred feet in width, the same being three hundred feet on each side of the center thereof, together with all dips, spurs and angles, and all other veins or lodes, the top or apex of which lie within said boundaries; (twenty acres of mining ground), situated in Copper Creek District, County of Skamania, State of Washington, said location being described and distinctly marked by reference to natural objects or permanent monuments, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

This claim lays above the "Big Elephant," just above the left hand branch of the creek, known as Copper Creek. This claim commences at the center of said Copper Creek, and runs 1500 feet E. by 70 degrees N., and 1500 feet each way from center. We claim 1500 feet on this vein or lode until properly surveyed and stakes corrected.

And we intend to hold and work said claim in accordance with the local customs and rules of miners and Mining Laws of the United States and of the State of Washington.
